Welcome

Mentors and coaches are apparently indispensible now. Enough time and money would mean I could coached in singing, fashion, math, elocution, time management, weight training, guitar, AND flipping houses. I can even be coached in making my fingernails look more attractive!

Tapping into greater wisdom is worth the effort. Having a confident voice speaking courage into you is invaluable. And here I keep thinking about Jesus. Not because I think he's a coach. But because he is the Good and Great Shepherd. This is arresting.

Jesus is not some dead man or an idea someone conjured up. He's the risen LORD Jesus Christ. What he offers is not simply the forgiveness of sin and a place in heaven. He also offers an experience of life that much more immediate.

The Shepherd leads, guides, provides for and walks with his people. He offers wisdom to the questioning; guidance to lost; and comfort to the widow, fatherless, vulnerable and poor. He offers shelter to the one hammered by life; an anchor point to those adrift; and a listening ear to the alone. He challenges the comfortable and comforts the challenged.

Life still brings it joys like when a man becomes a granddad or a woman a mother. Sorrows still come when a loved one passes. But Jesus walks with his people in

all of life. What Jesus offers is the experience of redemption, now.

We see evidence of this when God's people gather - really gather - take on board what the Bible teaches to then love one another, bear one another's burdens, and forgive one another. We see evidence of it when Jesus speaks to us through his word in daily devotions and when we know he has heard our prayers. Right there we discover joy. Not that determined by circumstance but joy that flows from by a deepening knowledge of, and relationship with, the Good and Great Shepherd. And there we experience his joy in us! To know someone greater and stronger takes joy in you ...that is the source of strength.

Seeing people come to Jesus so they experience redemption - can you image?

This stirs me. Might it stir us all.

Nestled in the mountains of northern Thailand lays a bustling little town on the banks of a flowing river. Each day the population swells with travelers, hippies and spiritual seekers coming to live amongst the thriving Thai-Buddhist and Muslim population. Here there are hundreds of temples, Vipassana Meditation centre, Shamans, spiritual Guru's, breath workers, Reiki masters and various healers. People are open, people are hungry and people are thirsty for spiritual truth

Just to the side of the town centre is one place that is a little different. It's a grand experiment, a group of devotees of Jesus, whose passion is to live out their devotion to Jesus daily as a community and to invite people in to experience, explore, curiously watch on, participate in what it means to live a life devoted to Jesus.

We do everything in circles, ensuring that people feel safe to share, to question, to nut through the deep issues and to help see that we are all pilgrims on a Echart Tole journey towards Truth, no matter what their current path. As devotees of Christ, we believe Jesus and Jesus alone is that Truth and as such our weeks are full of times of guided meditation on the words of Christ, sharing circles, women's bible circles, Teachings, creation care through permaculture garden-

ing, movement meditations, and music to Jesus in languages and styles from around the world.

We are seeing beautiful things here, hearts opening to Jesus. Sometimes our life feels like we are planting seeds, other times we watch peoples hearts and eyes open to the truth and it is incredible and such an honour to witness. Please pray for Alice* a Jewish American who was an atheist and strong follower of the teachings of Eckhart Tolle. Over the past year we have seen her open her heart to Jesus. She is so close! As we write this we prepare to meet with her and ask her where she is at with Jesus, and if she would like to take the step of faith into his arms. Please also pray for Laura* who has a history of Catholicism, but is feeling the draw of Jesus stronger in her life. She is currently weighing up the call of Christ and what it would mean for her to say Yes!

In the coming weeks we will be hosting a "Jesus Bhajans" performance (devotional Songs to Jesus in Hindi) in a popular night spot in town. Please pray that as we sing joyfully of our Bhakti (devotion to Jesus) in front of so many seekers, that they will see the light of Christ in us, and be drawn to him.
