### **INTRODUCING COMPASSION**

Compassion International started in 1952 with 35 children orphaned by the Korean War. Everett Swanson, an evangelist from Chicago, was ministering to troops when he saw children dying in the streets one morning and made a promise to do something about it. By 1977, more than 25,000 children were being supported. Compassion started in Australia in the same year.

The ministry of Compassion International grew to 250,000 children, babies and students by 1998, to 500,000 in 2003 and, eventually, one million in 2009. Today, Compassion is transforming the lives of more than 1.8 million children around the world through 12 international partner country offices. Over 109,000 of these children are currently supported through Compassion Australia.

Compassion's ministry is holistic child development in partnership with local churches in over 25 developing countries around the world.

Our child development programs are unique in that they are:



#### Christ-centred

Every child has the opportunity to hear and respond to the gospel message in a culturally relevant way.



#### Child-focused

Programs engage each child, fostering their spiritual, physical, socio-emotional and economic development.



### Church-based

Programs are run exclusively in partnership with local churches.

### **CHILDREN AND POVERTY**

More than 900 million people around the world still live in extreme poverty. Almost half of them—46 per cent—are aged 17 or younger.

Poverty causes children to struggle with frequent illness, chronic malnutrition and impaired physical and mental development. It denies children access to basic health care and education, weakens their protective environment and leaves them vulnerable to abuse and exploitation.

Poverty robs children of opportunities and choices. It saps them of their energy and undermines their confidence in the future. Poverty tells a child they do not matter, their story is not worth being told. It damages a child's self-worth and steals their hopes and dreams. Poverty can even destroy a child's belief in a God of love, hope and justice.

The world often overlooks children. They're too small; they can't vote; their rights are often unprotected. But God makes it clear that all children are precious to Him and should not be hindered or disregarded in any way. As Christians we have a responsibility to take up the mandate of Jesus and care for children, especially those living in poverty.

He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.

Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."

663 MILLION PEOPLE

663 million people still lack access to improved sources of drinking water.



2.4 BILLION PEOPLE

2.4 billion people don't use an improved sanitation facility, and more than 900 million practise open defecation.

Children from the poorest households in the world are twice as likely to die before their fifth birthday as children from the richest households.



438,000 DEATHS In 2015, malaria led to 438,000 deaths, of which more than two-thirds were children under five years of age.



830 WOMEN DIE EACH DAY 830 women die each day—303,000 each year—from complications in pregnancy and childbirth, 99 per cent of them in developing countries.




17.7 MILLION CHILDREN

In 2013, 17.7 million children worldwide lost one or both parents to AIDS. An estimated 3.2 million children under the age of 15 were living with HIV—and 190,000 children died of AIDS-related causes.



5.9 million children under the age of five die every year, most from preventable causes. That's more than 16,000 children dying per day.

### **COMMITTED TO CHILDREN**

Children are often the hardest hit by poverty's effects, yet they are the least able to do anything about their circumstances. We, as the Body of Christ, are called to act on behalf of children living in poverty.

It is God's heart for children that compels us. With more than 1700 passages relating to children in the Bible, children play a prevalent and pivotal role in Scripture and in God's Kingdom. The Bible recognises the vulnerability of children to neglect, abuse and injustice, and urges us to not overlook their needs, suffering and presence.

When Jesus' disciples were having a (heated) discussion about the Kingdom of God (Matthew 18:1-3; Luke 9:46), he did something entirely unexpected. He invited a small, unnamed child into their midst, confounding their theology and confronting their pride. "Unless you change and become like little children," he said, "you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3). And then, "Whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me" (Matthew 18:5). Therefore, as children are strategic in building the Kingdom of Heaven, it is vital that they are nurtured and valued in their formative years.

At Compassion, we believe one of the most effective ways to address poverty is by empowering children to become agents of transformation in their families, communities and, one day, their nations.

### **COMMITTED TO THE CHURCH**

With deep roots in their communities, local churches are often one of the most reliable, stable and accessible institutions in countries where governance is weak and infrastructure is lacking. Compassion has chosen to work exclusively in partnership with the Church to embrace individual children, develop the value in every child, and break through the unique obstacles for each child to be released from poverty.

By partnering with local churches, Compassion can train, support and empower local workers to identify and address each child's specific circumstances. Every child can receive the opportunity to overcome their personal circumstances and hear the gospel message.



# COMPASSION'S HOLISTIC CHILD DEVELOPMENT

Holistic child development is taking a child through a process of growth and fulfilment in all dimensions of their life: spiritually, socio-emotionally, economically and physically. Poverty is complex and has a devastating impact on every area of life. Therefore the response must come in all of these four areas.

Compassion believes holistic development is a long-term approach that starts before a child is born and continues through to school age and beyond. Holistic child development means we recognise that every child is special, uniquely made by God. That's why everything we do is tailored to meet the specific needs of individual children.



**COMPASSION'S CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM** is the core of Compassion's ministry to children and gives every registered child access to life-changing opportunities to be released from poverty in Jesus' name.



COMPASSION'S CRITICAL NEEDS builds upon the Child Sponsorship Program to address the issues facing children, their families and their communities. Critical Needs removes obstacles to children's development and implements preventative action. This can include providing safe water, emergency medical care, infrastructure, vocational training and disaster relief—all issues that need to be addressed for a child to be released from poverty.

### **CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM**

Developing, discipling and equipping children for life

Core to Compassion's ministry, the Child Sponsorship Program connects one sponsor with one child living in poverty, providing not only education and health care but also the encouragement needed to be socially confident and economically self-supporting.

A sponsor has the opportunity and privilege to invest into that child's future. Through prayer, letter writing and support, a sponsor plays a vital part in their sponsored child's development and spiritual growth.

Through a child development centre run by a local church, children are given the opportunity to hear the gospel, receive education and health care and play and learn in a safe place.

In partnership with Compassion, local churches in developing countries deliver the Child Sponsorship Program and aim for a child to be:

- Physically healthy and able to make good decisions about their health
- Motivated with skills to be economically self-supporting
- Able to interact with others in a healthy and compassionate manner
- Given the opportunity to hear the gospel message

When more help is needed

The effects of poverty are devastating and affect every area of a child's life. For babies, children and students living in poverty, there is no safety net; they live in environments that are unstable. When crisis hits their lives, they often have little hope for recovery.

Critical Needs provides solutions to meet children's individual needs by building upon the foundation of the Child Sponsorship Program. Critical Needs addresses obstacles in a child's external environment so they can continue their development in all areas. In partnership with the local church, Compassion identifies solutions to remove these obstacles while also implementing preventative action for a child and their family.

Giving to Critical Needs provides children with what they need for healthy development such as safe water, emergency medical care, extra nutritional support, infrastructure, vocational training and disaster relief.

Every child will benefit from funding for a Critical Need during their time in Compassion's program. Your support for Critical Needs helps provide customised care for all registered children, allows for increased preventative action, and continues Compassion's ministry to release children from all forms of poverty in Jesus' name.

However you choose to connect with Compassion, your church will be involved with proven, long-running, verifiable and strategic development programs that respect and affirm churches in the developing world.



## **GIFTS GCOMPASSION**

The Gifts of Compassion catalogue includes a range of gift ideas for friends or family members that also help children and families living in poverty. A Gift of Compassion comes with a card for the person the gift is for, which explains that a gift has been given in their honour to children in need. Funds raised go towards supporting Compassion's Critical Needs, which addresses obstacles to development for children in our programs. This could include health and hygiene improvement through building toilets, income–generation activities through livestock or malaria prevention through mosquito nets.



### **FINANCIAL INTEGRITY**

Compassion International has been recognised for excellent financial integrity by numerous independent publications and financial accountability groups. In its June 2016 assessment, Charity Navigator—the USA's largest charity evaluator—awarded Compassion International 100 marks out of 100 for accountability and transparency, as well as 84.45 for its financial score, earning us an overall three-star rating!



Approximately 80 per cent of donations to Compassion is used:

- For the development, delivery and supervision of programs
- For the purchase of goods and services for the direct benefit of the children in our programs
- To inform and update sponsors and facilitate their personal relationship with their sponsored child
- For community education in Australia

Approximately 20 per cent is allocated to cover all administration and fundraising costs in Australia.
