



St Paul's Castle Hill Volunteer Job Description ROLE TITLE: KIDS ALIVE JUNIOR HELPER

Our St Paul's mission is to bring people to Christ, build them in Christ, and send them out for Christ.

MINISTRY HEAD: Alice Christie (Volunteer)

STAFF MINISTRY LEADER: Linda Stephens (Children's Minister)

VISION/GOAL FOR THIS ROLE: The purpose of our Children's Ministry is to lead children across SPCH in accordance with our strategy of Bring, Build, & Send so that they are transformed into age-appropriate disciples of Jesus. Supporting discipleship in the home, Kids Alive is our key discipleship ministry for children 1 year old to 12 years old.

TIME COMMITMENT: Serving once per 6 weeks according to rostering. 9:30 – 11:30 Sunday mornings according to the Junior Helper roster.

FOR: Children/ Youth in years 5-8

CHARACTER:

- Be growing in their own faith in Jesus.
- Be personally committed to St. Paul's church.
- Be punctual and reliable.
- Be friendly.

CONVICTION:

- Be actively engaged in a Christian life, through regularly attending a service and Dteam (at least 6 months prior)
- · Live to give God the glory

COMPETENCY:

- I am optimistic in expecting to see God at work in transforming the lives of the kids I teach.
- I will carefully discipline my children because I know of its positive effect.
- I am a team member and will encourage the strengths I see in my brothers and sisters around me.
- I will use my gifts and talents that God has given to me for His glory.
- I will be thankful and praise God in all things, big and small.
- I will not settle for mediocrity.

KEY TASKS AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Arrive at 9.30 am
- Help set up any equipment, toys or play as directed by your room leader.
- Be ready, warm and WELCOMING to all children who come to the program.

- Look to INCLUDE children; ENCOURAGE them to join in with an activity with you. Sit
 alongside children talking with them about what they like in order for children to feel
 comfortable and loved.
- Be faithful in serving where rostered on. If you cannot make your date (holidays or illness etc). please let Linda know of these changes.

Supervision

- No child is ever left alone. No leader or junior helper is ever left alone with a child.
- If children require a band-aid or ice pak, call on the room leader.

TRAINING AND SUPPORT:

- You will be provided with a room leader who will give you support and direction. They will assign you a group of children to care for as well as a co-leader or two.
- On-the-job training. This informal learning will happen naturally in your team.

OTHER:

Group Management

- Helpers should not physically discipline any child.
- Remind children and uphold our rule: Love God, Love others!
- Helpers must not show favouritism.
- If children wish to return to their parent/ guardian:
 - First check if they are injured or sad and ask what happened.
 - If not major, distract them or re-direct them to another activity.
 - Stay with them to help them settle. Call on the Team Leader if still upset.

Managing Children Under Five

- Keep your instructions and expectations clear and simple (*Don't grab toys off others.* These toys are for everyone to share.)
- Redirect their attention when upset or frustrated (e.g. leader reads a book, give them another toy, completes a puzzle with them, plays playdough with them...).
- If tantrums occur, move furniture/equipment away from the child so they don't hurt themselves and move other children away from the child. Don't talk to the child, simply keep an eye on them (for safety reasons) but ignore their behaviour until the tantrum subsides.

Initiating Touch

- Leaders aim to minimize touching children.
- Always ask permission from a child before touching them (e.g. hold hand up and ask, High five?).
- Children are the ones to initiate touch.

Appropriate Touch 0-2 Years

- Hugging, patting, sitting on lap, rocking, holding hands are all appropriate forms of touch for this age group.
- When a child is upset, re-direct or distract the child with an activity, game or craft.

Appropriate Touch 3-4 Years

- Open hugs, sitting on a lap or beside the leader, and holding hands are all appropriate forms of touch for
- this age group.
- When a child is upset, re-direct or distract the child with an activity, game or craft.

Toileting

- Nappies will be changed by parents. The room leader will contact the parent to come and change the child.
- Parents are to take their pre-schooler to the toilet before dropping the child off to Kids Alive. PRESCHOOL children will be asked if they need to go, and will go as a group to the bathrooms. Adult leaders will encourage and remind children when these times are. If a child needs to go outside of this time, check first with your room leader (quickly!) – we want to try and avoid accidents on the floor if we can!

AFTER Kids Alive

- Help PACK up the kid's room that you served in and wipe down all hard surfaces, door handles etc. with disinfectant. Make sure cleaning products are returned to the cleaning cupboard. Ask your room leader if anything else needs to be done.
- During the week, pray for the little ones you cared for. Pray that they would know God's love.
