

St Paul's Castle Hill Volunteer Job Description ROLE TITLE: YEAR LEADER

Our St Paul's mission is to bring people to Christ, build them in Christ, and send them out for Christ.

MINISTRY HEAD: Ben Razey & Holly Turner STAFF MINISTRY LEADER: Ben Razey & Holly Turner

VISION/GOAL FOR THIS ROLE: The Year Leader's role is to form discipleship-based relationships, as you assist in building the youth up in Jesus and send them out for Jesus.

TIME COMMITMENT: Year Leaders will serve Friday nights during term time. Year Leaders at 68 will be there from 5:30pm-8:30pm, and Year Leaders at X will be there from 7:20pm-10:20pm. Times on combined nights (2-3 times a term) will be different. In addition to this, included in this commitment is attendance at Leader's Retreat (one weekend in the July School Holidays) and Impakct (our 5-night camp in the middle of the Summer School Holidays).

Additional time commitments are for d-team (youth bible study) leaders, which take place for an hour and a half either Friday before crossfire, Sunday before 6pm church or mid-week.

KEY REQUIREMENTS:

You must hold a current WWCC#, which you should provide to our administration team along with your date of birth for verification.

You must have a current Safe Ministry certificate and stay up to date with a refresher course every 3 years.

CHARACTER:

- Value and be growing in a relationship with Jesus
- Live a personal life that is above reproach
- Have others around you in your walk with Christ who affirm your character (staff, small group leader, team leader references)
- Have integrity to 'be the same person in every room'

CONVICTION:

- Be actively engaged in the life of St Paul's church, through regularly attending a service and small group (at least 3 months prior)
- Agree with SPCH Vision, Mission & Statement of Beliefs (<u>https://stpauls.church/what-we-believe/</u>)
- An understanding of our Vital Signs
- Be willing to agree and adhere to the guidelines set out in the Crossfire Ministries Leaders Manuel

COMPETENCY:

- Ability to explain and explore the bible & lead discussion groups
- Engaging in pastoral care of the students in your d-team and year group
- A prayerful Attitude
- Strong faith & confidence in sharing the gospel
- Demonstrate effective leadership qualities.
- A positive and proactive attitude, with good 'buy in' to various crossfire activities

KEY TASKS AND RESPONSIBLITIES:

- On a normal night of crossfire, these are the arrival and finish times:
 - For 68 arrive at 5:30pm & finish at 8:30pm
 - For X arrive at 7:20pm & finish at 10:20pm
 - On combined nights arrive at 6:30pm & finish at 10:00pm
- If you are unwell, please contact your year coordinator
- Form meaningful discipleship-based relationships with the students in your grade
- Coordinate and run year time and all-in-time according to your rostered week

- Lead discussion groups with the students post sermon
- Actively participating in all aspects of crossfire including games, discussion groups and meetings
- Co-lead a D-Team (youth bible study), assisting in planning and writing the study, as well as discipling the students in the group *(favourable, but not mandatory for all crossfire leaders)*

TRAINING AND SUPPORT:

- Each week, there is regular training organised by the Team Leaders. In this training, a variety of things are covered.
- Training and support is also provided through our yearly leader's retreat
- For pastoral and other support, you will meet up termly with your Year Coordinator
- Communication is done through a leader's Facebook group, or lead team group chat
- You will receive 'on the job' training by your year coordinator, or other year leaders

CROSSFIRE LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE:
